EMMY RECIPIENTS HONORED BY
SF/NORTHERN CALIFORNIA
TELEVISION ACADEMY

Coveted golden Emmy statuettes were presented to 79 recipients by the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences San Francisco/Northern California Chapter at the 19th Annual Awards Ceremony, Saturday, May 19, 1990. The San Francisco-based NATAS Chapter also awarded four Governors' Citations and two scholarships.

Charles Schulz, creator of the popular "Peanuts" cartoon strip, and Lee Mendelson, Producer of the "Peanuts" television programs, received special Governors' Award Emmys for their creativity in the area of children's programming. Both are long-time members of this TV Academy Chapter.

The Outstanding Achievement-Single News Broadcast Awards were presented to KPIX, San Francisco (large market category), and KTVN-TV, Reno (small market category). This is the first year that Reno entrants have been judged in the San Francisco/Northern California area.

Other Emmy Awards were presented to individuals for outstanding achievement in areas ranging from news segments and

reporting, documentaries, public service and promotional announcements and various crafts. Nearly 600 entries were judged by peer panels located in Boston and New York City, resulting in 133 nominees honored in the 1990 Awards Program. Emmy statuettes were awarded to 77 recipients for 47 entries in 39 different categories.

The four long-time members of the Northern California Chapter who were honored with Governors' Citations are: Darryl Compton, KRON-TV; Linda Giannecchini, Mieuli & Associates; Spencer Michels, KQED-TV; and Frank Zamacona, Zamacona Productions.

Two scholarships of \$1,000 each were presented. The Kenneth Langley Scholarship for Writing was given to Rochelle Jackson, University of California at Berkeley. The Peter Marino Production Scholarship was won by Terrence L. Borden, Leeward Community College, Honolulu.
