





Passion is what drives Joyce
Mitchell. Couple that with 40 years
of experience in TV as a journalist
and Joyce strives to produce
memorable programs that make a
difference in this community, nation,
and world. She has four regional
Emmy® Awards for her documentary work and 20 nominations.
She's also won an Associated Press
California-Nevada Best Documentary award for a program on teens
and violence. Joyce now serves

as a Governor on the Board of NATAS.

In 1972, after graduating editor-in-chief of her college newspaper, the second woman to hold the job, Joyce infiltrated the then male-dominated newspaper business, becoming one of two women and the youngest member of the Capitol Press Corp in Sacramento. She helped pioneer political reporting for women in the early and mid 70s. Joyce left the political arena to pursue a Master's Degree and accepted an internship at Sacramento NBC Affiliate KCRA. She was hired to produce newscasts and worked 13 years at Channel 3, eight years producing the 11 O'Clock News. She then moved over to CBS13 where she stayed 10 years producing election coverage and other special projects. From there, she was hired as Senior Producer at KVIE. Joyce also taught Broadcast Journalism at Sacramento State University for 16 years. She has a BA in Government-Journalism and an MA in Communication Studies.

She is now an independent television producer with her own company 4U Productions. An HIV/AIDS activist since 1986, Joyce co-founded and chairs the Sacramento non-profit Capital City AIDS Fund.

Master of Ceremonies JESSICA AGUIRRE

Anchor/Reporter, NBC Bay Area KNTV Silver Circle Class of 2018



Jessica Aguirre is the 5, 6 and 11 p.m. evening anchor at NBC Bay Area News and an Emmy® Award-winning journalist. Jessica has been a primetime evening anchor, in the Bay Area for more than 20 years.

In addition to anchoring the evening news, Jessica is the co-host of NBC Bay Area's Race in America: The Conversation alongside Marcus Washington. The show explores racial equity and social injustice and at-

tempts to bridge the divide between backgrounds and generations.

Jessica began her career at the Spanish language network, Univision, while attending the University of Miami. Before arriving in the Bay Area in 1998, she anchored and reported in Los Angeles and Miami, earning Emmy® Awards for her series on the struggles of migrant children and for her investigative work on child molesters, as well as an Associated Press award for her series chronicling the struggle of boat people fleeing Cuba. During her tenure at NBC Bay Area, Jessica won an Emmy® for her poignant series on the emotional journey of an East Bay transgender teen and her efforts to preserve her fertility before undergoing sex reassignment surgery, another Emmy® for her live coverage of the "Ghostship" warehouse fire in Oakland, and for field anchoring from the deadly Sonoma and Napa county firestorms.

Jessica resides in the East Bay, with her two daughters. Her devotion to learning, supporting children and local charities has her routinely on the lecture circuit in the Bay Area discussing education, gender equity and minority advancement in the workplace.

News producing is not easy work and yet Bill Green did it for decades. He oversaw the top-rated 6PM News at KGO ABC7. He has been dedicated to community journalism, trying to cover the issues of importance to the Bay Area while maintaining the standards and ethics of overall good journalism and newswriting.

In his early career as a reporter, Green uncovered discrepancies in a job displacement program; covered a major North Coast Indian fishing rights' controversy;

undercover marijuana raids; and coverage of a teachers' strike.

Born and raised in Humboldt County, Green started at KVIQ in Eureka in 1978 as a general assignment reporter the Monday after he graduated from college. Two years later, he moved on to KFSN in Fresno as a newscast and elections producer and feature reporter. Then, in 1993, he was hired as a producer at KGO.

Green has generously mentored people in the newsroom and has received Emmy_® and RTNDA Awards.

Deirdre Fitzpatrick joined the KCRA news team 25 years ago on New Year's Eve 1997. She anchors the weekday morning news and created and hosts Hearst Television's first podcast, Dying to Ask. She's responsible for creating an hour of digital and television content each week based on podcast interviews. Before arriving at Channel 3, Fitzpatrick was at KCCI-TV in Des Moines, Iowa. She's a four-time Emmy®

Award recipient in writing, reporting and anchoring and has a bachelor's degree in Journalism from the University of Missouri-Columbia. Deirdre reported live around the world on the Hearst Television Olympic Team for 10 straight Olympics and led KCRA's coverage of the 2020/2022 Olympics stateside. She serves on the board of the Sacramento Running Association and is an accomplished endurance athlete having completed 25 marathons, 10 ultra runs and multiple Ironman Triathlons. She's also a wife and mother of two teenage sons which she says is far more tiring than getting up at oh dark thirty to anchor the news or

compete as an amateur athlete.

Horn is a photographer with passion, determination – and sense of humor.





DAVE RAMOS

Engineer, KCRA 3, Sacramento Silver Circle Class of 2022



Since 1974, Engineer Dave Ramos has been on the scene of breaking news, sometimes camping out, often traveling across country to get the story – and always using integrity to get it right. Ramos started out operating an ENG truck for Sacramento KCRA Channel 3 and then moving into Satellite News Gathering (SNG).

For nearly 50 years, Ramos has been producing remotes, covering just about every major sport or news event in the country. KCRA

is an aggressive station that invests in getting the story and Ramos is a perfect match. He knows the equipment, news, does TV news reporting in a pinch and is a highly personable guy. He's successful in the field and with colleagues because he's a straight shooter.

In 2017, Ramos traveled to Haiti to help dig and build freshwater wells. He signed up for the task after learning that annually, 360,000 children under the age of five die from unsafe drinking water.

ROB ROTH

Retired Reporter KTVU FOX 2 Silver Circle Class of 2022



After nearly 40 years with Oakland Fox station KTVU, veteran reporter Rob Roth retired in 2022. Having covered thousands of stories during his career, the broadcast journalist's last day at KTVU was in March.

Roth is known for covering news with care and compassion and has been on the frontlines of countless breaking stories, including the 1989 Loma Prieta earthquake, the 1991 Oakland firestorm and COVID-19 pandemic. His beat included San Francisco City Hall, where he

covered several mayors, including when U.S. Senator Dianne Feinstein was mayor. Still, for Roth, it was amazing that San Francisco Mayor London Breed honored his retirement with a surprise ceremony. The mayor told Roth that the city greatly appreciated his dedicated and thorough reporting throughout the years and wished him well in retirement.

As for Roth, he's adjusting to a quieter life these days but still listens to and watches the news. "That's what got me here in the first place," he said.

KOPI SOTIROPULOS

Great Day Anchor/Weatherman, KMPH FOX 26, Fresno Gold Circle Class of 2022, Silver Circle Class of 2018



What a journey it's been for Great Day Anchor/Weatherman Kopi Sotiropulos of KMPH 26 Fresno. Born in Greece, as a child, his parents moved the family to California. Beautiful agricultural country was in mind after life in Greece with an abundance of grapes, figs, peaches, almonds, and olives.

And Fresno it was. Starting elementary school not knowing a word of English was challenging. But Sotiropulos was determined. He prevailed, moved on to

Fresno City College then majored in broadcasting at San Francisco State. After graduating in 1971, he was hired at KMPH TV 26, the month the station began broadcasting. For six years, he produced, wrote, shot, and edited commercials and promos. And then he found himself hosting "Dialing for Dollars."

Before long, he and his wife Elaine packed their bags and moved to Hollywood where Sotiropulos became an actor. Ten years in Tinsel Town and he accumulated credits on programs like "Beverly Hills Cop II" with Eddie Murphy, "Three's Company," and "Highway to Heaven." And that's cutting the list short.

But then with two kids, it was time to move on. Sotiropulos returned to the San Joaquin Valley and KMPH in 1992 where he's been working ever since.

From Greece, to Hollywood, to home – in Fresno – Sotiropulos has a career that's been absolutely built on a foundation of gold.

SPENCER CHRISTIAN

Meteorologist, ABC7 KGO Gold Circle Class of 2022, Silver Circle Class of 2013



With more than 50 years of experience in television news, Spencer Christian is a memorable face in the Bay Area and around the country. He's been a news reporter, sportscaster, talk show host, and weather forecaster.

Christian's assignments have taken him to 50 states and five continents. He has interviewed six presidents, and some of the most prominent figures in world affairs. However, Christian said that some of his most memorable moments have been stories on ordinary

people doing extraordinary things.

He said he was a news junkie as a kid, studied journalism in college and the began his career in 1971 as a news reporter at the NBC affiliate in Richmond, Virginia, just 25 miles from his childhood home. Soon, he was on his way to WABC in New York City where he stayed 9 years, first as a weatherman, then morning show host and eventually main sportscaster.

Meanwhile, he would fill in on weather for ABC's Good Morning America. In 1986, he was asked to join GMA full time. Christian stayed there 22 years and then heard the Bay Area calling his name. He's been with ABC7 since 1999.
