With great honor, we welcome David Louie to host our annual luncheon event.

David logged more than 50 years at ABC7 News Bay Area, retiring from the station in 2022 as the longest tenured and first Asian American reporter. News has been in his blood since he wrote for his high school newspaper. He loves technology and was thrilled to cover Silicon Valley and the innovators who keep creating new products and services.

David has received four regional Emmy® Awards. In 2015, he was presented with the Governors' Award, the highest honor a chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences (NATAS) can bestow. He served many years as a Governor and Awards Chair for the San Francisco Northern California Chapter.

David's mark on TV reaches far outside the Bay Area having served at the Academy's highest level, elected national chairman (1994-96) and vice-chairman (1990-94). He's also been national president of the Asian American Journalists Association and a long-time board member of the Radio Television Digital News Association where he has endowed a scholarship for AAPI students at Northwestern University's Medill School of Journalism.





Jodi Hernandez Reporter NBC Bay Area

She's a reporter who knows her craft! Jodi Hernandez joined KNTV as a general assignment reporter in 2002, working primarily on the station's 5, 6 & 11pm weekday newscasts.

No question, she's a veteran. Jodi started her career in 1992 at KCPM in Chico, then moved east to Wichita, Kansas to work at KAKE-TV. Two years later, she was back in Northern California at KOVR TV. Then, it was on to NBC Bay Area.

Jodi has received numerous awards including a regional Emmy®, an RTNDA award, the NLGJA Seigenthaler Video Media Award and the duPont/Columbia award.

Jodi was also inducted into the National Association of Hispanic Journalists' Hall of Fame in 2017.

Now, Justin's coming full circle from scholarship award recipient to Silver Circle inductee!







Steve Swatt is an award-winning political broadcast journalist who launched his TV career at KCRA in 1969 after reporting stints at the SF Examiner and United Press Int'l in Los Angeles. 55 years later, he continues to provide political analysis for several media outlets in the Sacramento market.

During his career as a reporter and political correspondent, Steve extensively covered public policy, elections, and numerous presidents/governors. With an MA Degree in Journalism from UC Berkeley, Steve has taught and mentored many graduate students.

He remains actively involved with the California Conservation Corps Foundation and Friends of California Archives boards, and he has served on the Alliance for Better Campaigns board and Community Learning Advisory Board.

Steve authored numerous books including Game Changers: Twelve Elections That Transformed California.

He has received an Emmy Award for his work, along with awards from National Health Journalism, State Bar, and SPJ, Association of American Political Consultants and Sacramento Public Relations Society.

Being a woman breaking into TV news in 1974, there have been many firsts for Pamela Young.

Working at KPIX on the show called All Together Now with the legendary Belva Davis (Silver Circle 1989), Pamela became the first Asian-American reporter to work on that program.

Born and raised in Hawaii, Pamela came to the mainland to attend San Francisco State University, graduating in 1973. Most newsrooms were packed with men back then, but that didn't stop Pamela. She stayed at KPIX for a year, then moved over to PBS station KQED. Eventually, she returned home to Hawaii, taking a job as an anchor/reporter for KHON. She's received 12 Emmy® Awards.

In 1984, Pamela launched a show in Hawaii called *Mixed Plate* that's still on the air today. It covers a little bit of everything. "Something Japanese, Chinese, Filipino." Pamela has written a travel column and a book entitled *My Name Is Makia Malo* about an 80-year-old person living with leprosy.

Pamela received the prestigious NATAS Governors' Award in 2024. She also chairs the San Francisco Northern California Chapter's Awards Committee, and mentors young people entering the TV business. At this point, there's no plan to retire.

She's a true pioneer!
